Weather delays, staff shortages and other issues seem to be common these days. It's so hard to **wait** when there are places we want to be and things we want to do!

It seems like we have been **waiting a long time** for our next W2E weekends. Our hearts are yearning for the fellowship, blessings and joy of those gatherings. I recently read this devotional by Leland Gamson in an issue of "The Upper Room". This story resonated for me as we **wait** for our weekends to arrive.

"We're calling because we need your prayers, Pastor. We are trapped between flights in Chicago because of the snowstorm." Our pastor asked, "Are you inside where it is dry and warm?" "Yes," I replied. "Do you have access to water and food?" Again, I said "Yes'". Then he asked, "Are you sick?" I answered, "No." He said to me, "Then you aren't really trapped, are you? I'll pray for you to be of service to the Lord where you are." We prayed together and my attitude changed almost immediately.

I bought children's books at an airport store and offered them to families with children. My husband struck up a conversation with an older man wearing a Korean War veteran's hat. Later we offered to wait in the food line for others. It became easy for us to approach others, knowing we were all in the same situation. Additionally, several worried-looking, stranded passengers accepted our offer to pray with them. The 16 hours in the terminal went rather quickly when we made ourselves available to others. We were not trapped. We were in the right place at the right time to reflect the love of God.

Friends, during this time of **waiting**, we are all in the right place at the right time. May each of us be witnesses to God's loving presence right where we are. May we reach out to those who need reassurance. May we lighten the load that someone is bearing. May we connect with someone who desires a closer relationship with our Lord and invite that person to attend the next Walk to Emmaus. None of us know God's timing or why it seems to take so much longer than we'd like sometimes. But rest in the truth that **He is faithful** and His plans for us are perfect!
