#### Gifts We Don't Ask For

Have you ever asked for something you wanted? Have you ever been given something you didn't ask for? Attending the Walk weekend in 2018 was not something I asked for, but through the persistence of my sponsor and my choice to attend, the result was a meaningful experience I very much needed and it created a lasting impact!

I have two daughters, aged 10 and 8. The one thing that they, along with other children, are very good at is always asking for what they want. They don't always get what they want and additionally there are things I cannot give them or are not in their best interest to have. Most things they simply don't need. When I think about this with regards to our heavenly Father, I feel it's the same for us. We're all his children and have wants and needs. He wants us to be happy and find enrichment in our lives through his teachings and gifts.

Recently Cora my 10-year-old daughter was given a silver spoon with her name engraved in the handle. The gift was from a member of the Walk community and the spoon had been in their family for generations. They no longer had a "Cora" in their family but shared as much history about it as was known. It was a custom that a spoon be given to children celebrating their baptism and to wish new-born children happiness and prosperity throughout life. This is an example of sharing something special and meaningful in your life with someone who was not expecting it.

Romans 14:19 says "Let us therefore make every effort to do what leads to peace and to mutual edification", meaning that we improve morally and intellectually by building up others. It's self-sacrifice, sharing our gifts and resources to lift up others. That impact is something that may require persistence, but the enrichment of the lives of others will be well worth the effort.

With Christmas fast approaching, (I know Thanksgiving isn't here yet) please think of making a Christmas list of what you want and would ask Santa Clause for. Kids do this and mail their lists to the North Pole. As mentioned above, there are some things we ask for and don't receive. Other times in life we receive gifts that we never asked for or didn't expect.

This year instead of making the above list for Santa Clause, how would your list look if you made it for Jesus? Would it contain material items like toys, electronic gadgets, or clothes? Or would it include prayers for healing, health, salvation and goodwill towards others?

Proverbs 16:9... "In their hearts, humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps."

One important theme we hear throughout the weekend is to share all good things. At one point all of us trusted our sponsors and made the decision to attend the Walk to Emmaus. I, like many others, could find any excuse not to attend. We're all busy. I won't dive into the decision-making process and psychology of how to influence people, but without us asking others, they will not be able to make a decision that could change their life.

Hebrews 13:16... "Do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased." This is the verse Cora chose on her own to include in the thank you card she wrote for the silver spoon with her name on it.

I encourage everyone to scroll through the contact list in your phone, make your list to God, pray, and then reach out. Ask for what you want and give the gift they didn't ask for but may need or have been praying for! We all hope many friends and family members will trust you and commit to attending the Walk to Emmaus.
